God is a Covenant Making God

(Although He has no need He binds Himself to people as a covenant partner)

God is a Covenant Keeping God

(Once He has made a covenant He never forgets it. He always follows through with the commitments He made)

God is a Covenant Making God

(Although He has no need He binds Himself to people as a covenant partner)

Dipleuric (two sided covenant) parties of generally equal standing entering a mutually binding agreement or a sovereignly imposed monopleuric injunction or a sovereign administration of grace and promise

- God is a Covenant Revealing God
 (God has to reveal the covenant to man in order for man to know it)
- God is a Covenant Enabling God
 (God gives grace to man to fulfill his part of the covenant)

¹³ When God made his promise to Abraham, since there was no one greater for him to swear by, he swore by himself, ¹⁴ saying, "I will surely bless you and give you many descendants." ¹⁵ And so after waiting patiently, Abraham received what was promised. ¹⁶ People swear by someone greater than

God to lie, we who have fled to take hold of the hope set before us may be greatly encouraged. 19 We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain, ²⁰ where our forerunner, Jesus, has entered on our behalf. He has become a high priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek.
