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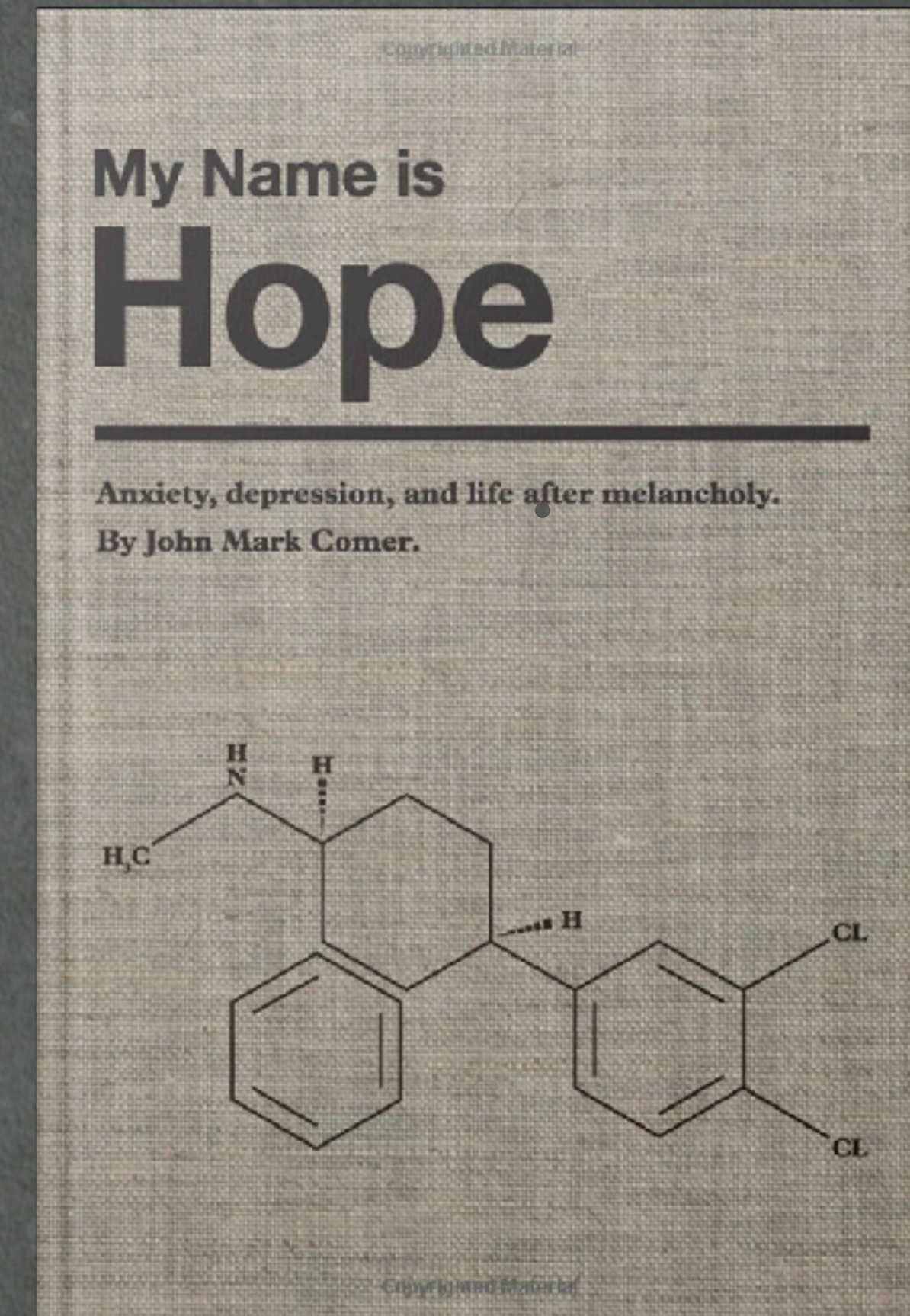
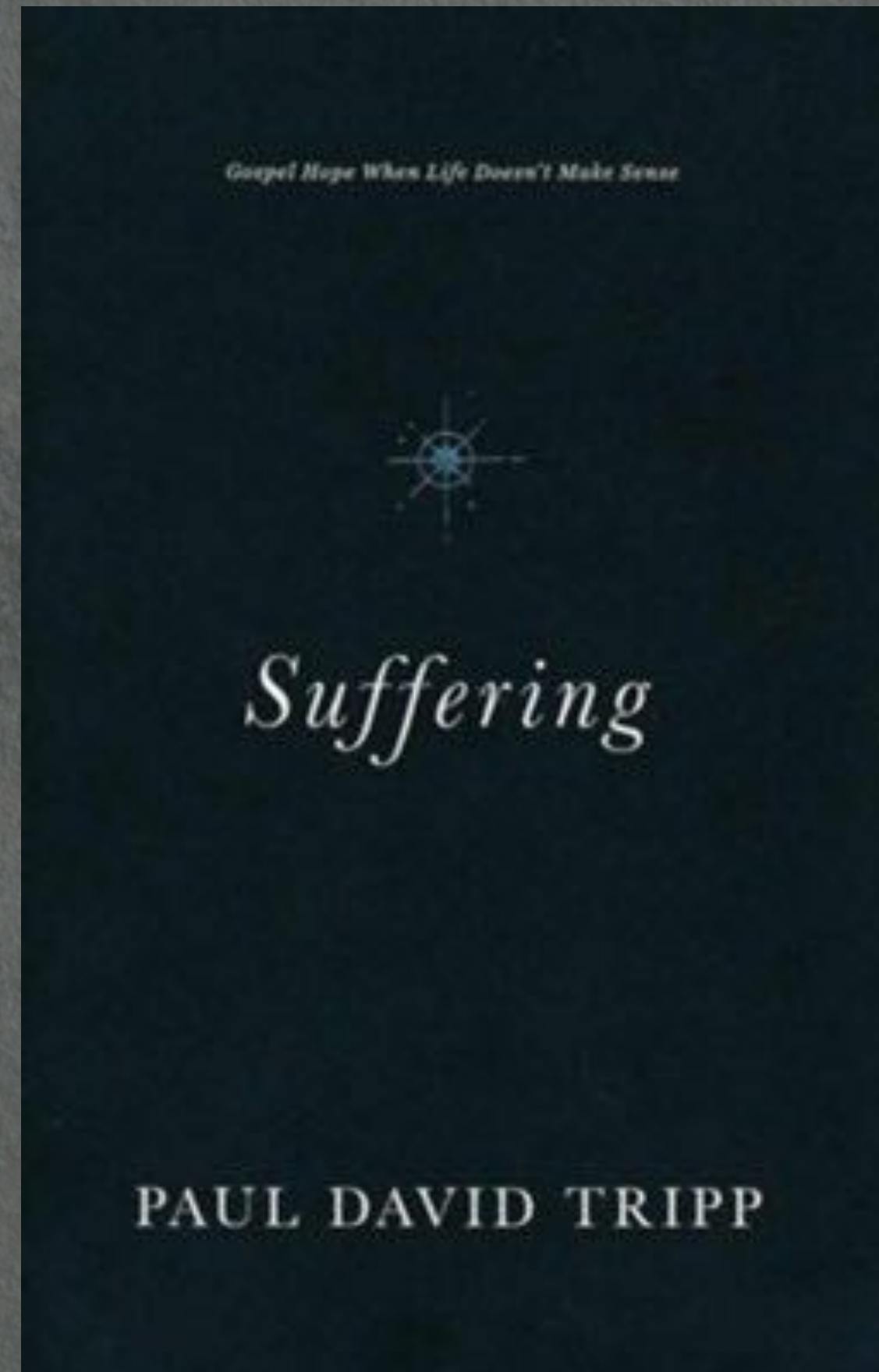
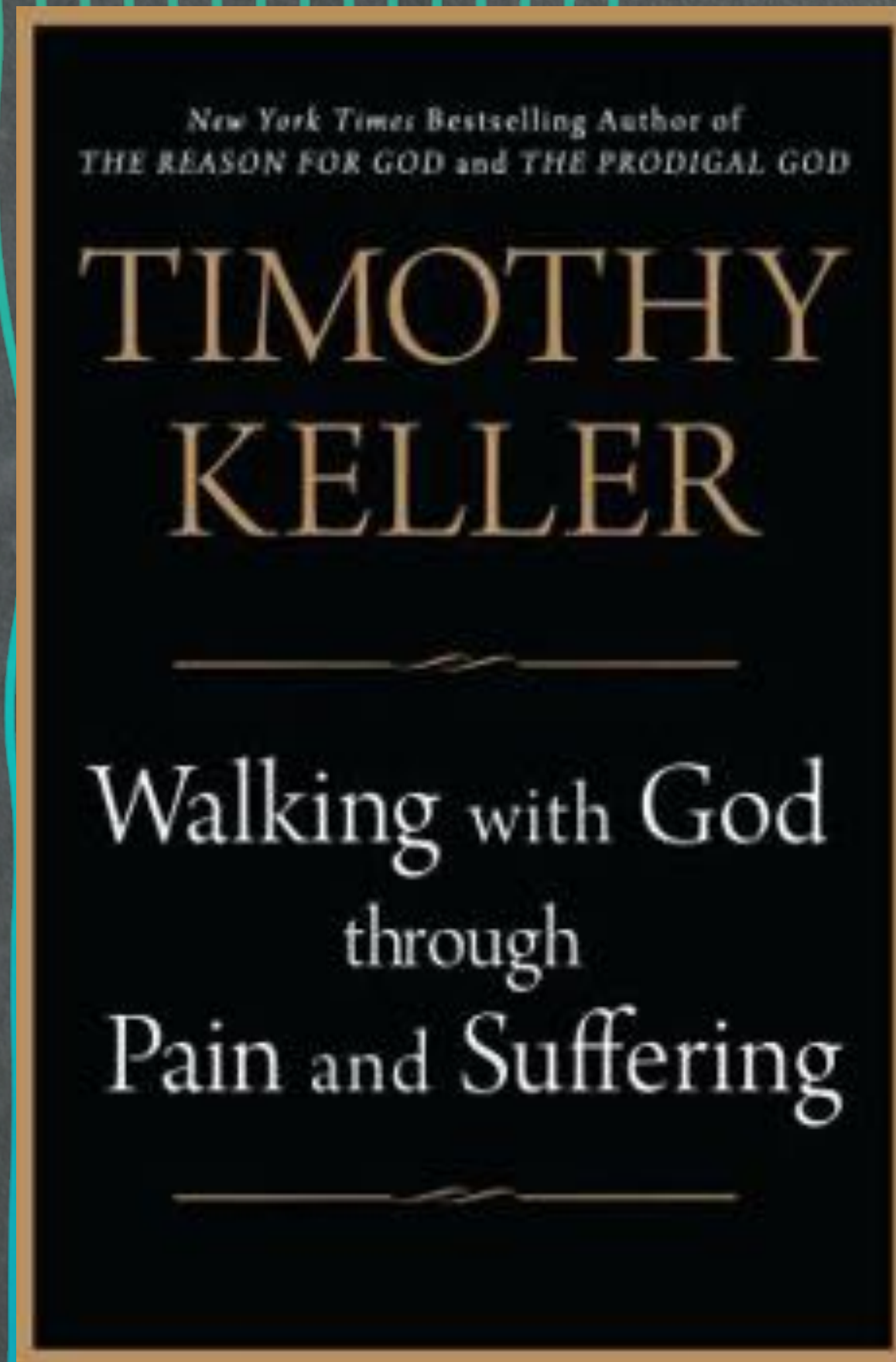

5. False Doctrine Leads to False Expectations

Suffering is not what happens to “bad” people or non-Christians

Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation—but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. **For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.**

ROMANS 8:12-13

Suffering is not what happens to “bad” people or non-Christians

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, “Abba, Father.” The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God’s children. Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

ROMANS 8:14-17

I consider that **our present sufferings** are not worth comparing with **the glory that will be revealed** in us.

2. You can hold hope and disappointment in the same moment

Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. **For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.**

2 CORINTHIANS 4:16-18

You are without Hope, if you are without God

For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. **For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it,** in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

ROMANS 8:19-21

You are without Hope, if you are without God

We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, **who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved.** But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

You are without Hope, if you are without God

remember that at that time **you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship** in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, **without hope and without God in the world.**

EPHESIANS 2:12

We suffer and God is still good

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified.

ROMANS 8:28-30

False Doctrine Leads to False Expectations

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. **Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?**

As it is written:

**“For your sake we face death all day long;
we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.”**

ROMANS 8:31-36

False Doctrine Leads to False Expectations

No, **in all these things** we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
