5	670 BC	Ironwork Metallurgy was key to technological, economic and military advancement






¹ The law is only a shadow of the good things that are coming—not the realities themselves. For this reason **it can never**, by the same sacrifices repeated endlessly year after year, **make perfect** those who draw near to worship. ² Otherwise, would they not have stopped being offered? For the worshipers would have been **cleansed once for all**, and would no longer have felt guilty for their sins.

HEBREWS 10:1-17




3 But those sacrifices are an annual reminder of sins. **4** It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins **5** Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said: "Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; **6** with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased. **7** Then I said, 'Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll— I have come to do your will, my God.'"


⁸ First he said, "Sacrifices and offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not desire, nor were you pleased with them"—though they were offered in accordance with the law. ⁹ Then he said, "Here I am, I have come to do your will." He sets aside the first to establish the second. ¹⁰ And **by that will, we have been made holy** through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ **once for all**.

11 Day after day every priest stands and performs his religious duties; again and again he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. **12** But when this priest had offered **for all time one sacrifice for sins**, he sat down at the right hand of God, **13** and since that time he waits for his enemies to be made his footstool. **14** For **by one sacrifice** he has made **perfect forever** those who are being made holy.






22 "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. **23** This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. **24** But **God raised him from the dead**, freeing him from the agony of death, because **it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him.**

39 "We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, **40 but God raised him from the dead** on the third day and caused him to be seen. **41** He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen—by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.
